### **Cost-Saving Tips** THE LOCATION

Alli and Matt booked the Confederate Home. where they hosted a garden ceremony and sitdown brunch on the same property for one rate.

#### THE ATTIRE

The Bride: All got a past-season Vera Wang gown at a sample sale, which costs less than a current release.

The Bridal Party: The couple opted for only a matron of honor and best man, who were able to select (with guidance) their own attire.

The Ushers: Male ushers wore their own suits and the couple gifted them ties, which brought the color scheme together.

#### THE DETAILS


Décor: Elegant but simple ribbon streamers in purple and green gave a lot of bang for the couple's buck.

Stationery: A designer pal made the invites, and Alli created programs herself with a color printer, kraft paper, and ribbon.

The Photographer: Setting a strict shooting time limit and opting for an online album (rather than an actual one) to trim photo costs.



HAIR APPARENT: Alli sought out a newbie at a local upscale salon. She was thrilled with the results and saved by working with "junior" talent.



SWIFT GIFT: Alli purchased kraft paper gift bags, which her mother then hand-painted with palmettos. Since most guests were out-of-towners, Alli included local guidebooks (free from the visitors center), pralines, and Charleston cookbooks, which were bought at a discount since they were ordered in bulk. Tissue and raffia in the wedding colors-purple, orange, and green-tied the package together.





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
